

Repairs: Electrics

We will send an electrician to repair faulty electrics but if we find that it is one of your appliances that caused the problem we will charge you for the call out. Please carry out the below checks before calling us.

- Make sure that any credit meter is topped up.

If one of your trip switches, located in your fuse box, goes off, you need to find out what caused it:

1. Turn off and un-plug all appliances.
2. Find the fuse board (usually located on the wall in the hallway, under the stairs or in the kitchen).
3. Flip the fuse board switch back 'on'.
4. Plug in each appliance one by one to see which one causes the problem.
5. You will know the appliance is faulty because it either won't work or the switch in the fuse box will flip to 'off' again.
6. If a light bulb is flipping the trip switch, when you turn the switch back 'on' the light will no longer working.

- If all your power is off, see if the neighbours are affected.
- If it is a general power cut, contact the electricity company.
- If one appliance is not working, try plugging it into another socket.
- Check whether the fuse in the plug has blown. You can check this by seeing if any other appliances work using the plug
- Running too many appliances from one socket may cause fuses to blow, especially if you are using electric fires.
- If one light is not working, check whether the bulb has blown or the fitting is faulty.
